BEL = Faculty of Business Economics & Law

<u>Program</u> = What you are studying e.g. Bachelor of Business Management

<u>Course</u> = You choose the courses within the program you're studying *e.g. Foundations of Marketing MKTG1510*)

The value of a course is measured in **units** (#) - Most courses will be #2


GPA = Grade Point Average

<u>Compulsory Course</u> = A course which must be passed in order to complete the requirements of a particular program

Major = An area of specialised study within a program

<u>Elective Course</u> = Courses students can choose, which, when added to the compulsory courses, enable the program requirements to be met

<u>Prerequisite Course</u> = A Course (s) that must have been previously passed to be able to enrol in a particular course

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS – UNDERGRADAUTE



- Commencement:
 - Semester 1 (February), or Semester 2 (July)
- Academic entry requirements:
 - > Successful completion of 2 years of a Bachelor Degree with an average grade of at least 70% (60% is a pass)
 - >The following is a sample of degrees from three schools (this list is not exhaustive):
 - School of Economics and Trade
 - > Bachelor of Arts in Economics (Finance) or (Insurance);
 - > Bachelor of Arts in Economics (International Economics and Trade)
 - School of Accounting
 - > Bachelor of Management in Accounting, Accounting, Financial Management and Auditing
 - School of English for International Business
 - > Bachelor of Management in International Business
 - > Bachelor of Arts International Business-Innovation, International Business, Business English
 - > UQ Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of Economics
 - Successful completion of the GDUFS subject Calculus with a score of at least 60%
- English proficiency requirements:
 - > IELTS overall score of 6.5; score of 6 in writing, reading, speaking and listening
 - TOEFL iBT overall score of 87; a score of 21 in writing; a score of 19 in reading, speaking and listening

GDUFS 2+2 Articulation Arrangement



- Up to a maximum of 16 units (8 courses) credit will be granted upon successful completion of 2 years of the program at GDUFS towards specified BEL programs
 - SEIB **Example** Bachelor of Arts towards the UQ Bachelor of Commerce

- 50% of the published test fee will be funded by UQ. The remaining 50% is paid by the student






